Municipal elections on November 5, 2017

The general municipal elections will be held on November 5 all around Quebec province. This event represents an important moment of democracy for the municipalities and gives the opportunity to citizens to choose the representative associated to their district, who will work on behalf of Pincourt population.

Stay connected to your Town: Info-P

Do you know the new Town's platform, Info-P?

It allows sending short messages by e-mail, text messages or phone calls, in case of an emergency, in order to inform you about a priority situation or coming activities in the town. The posts are available at any time on the website of Info-P (www.infop.ca). The mission of this new platform is to make the information about the Town of Pincourt more accessible.

Registration

To register to Info-P, you need to go to the website www.infop.ca, in the section "Registration". You will need to choose the categories you wish to receive notice for, either by e-mail, text message or vocal message (only used for major alert like flooding or ice storm).

- Emergencies (mandatory)
- Recreation and culture
- Snow removal
- Info-Works
- Public sessions
- Domestic waste collection

Town Council Meeting: where and when?

At Town Council meetings, the Town's elected representatives come together to make decisions in the Town's best interests in the form of by-laws or resolutions.

The Town Council generally makes its decisions by majority vote of members present and must meet at least once a month. In Pincourt, the Town Council holds its meetings on **the second Tuesday of every month at 7 pm, at the Omni-Centre**. If needed, the Town Council may also hold special meetings throughout the year. You are free to attend these public assemblies at any time and express your views or ask for information during question periods.
