CIVIL SECURITY

Together, let's be ready!

On January 19, the Agreement on the establishment of an intermunicipal approach to civil protection came into effect. This approach will enable the Town and its partner municipalities to establish an effective organizational structure to provide an optimal response in the event of a disaster, in compliance with current legislation.

While the work is progressing as expected, the Pincourt municipal council, with the support of the Très-Saint-Rédempteur and Pointe-Fortune councils, wants to move quickly to tackle "RESILIENCE" issues. This is to be achieved by focusing on the following areas:

Organization - Citizens - Humanitarian and community organizations.

- "ORGANIZATION" component: The autonomy of elected representatives, managers and municipal employees is essential to organizational resilience, requiring their personal and family autonomy.
- "CITIZENS" component: A review of our current practices is imperative in view of the predicted impact of climate change, requiring adaptation to ensure future viability.
- "HUMANITARIAN AND COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS" component: we need to encourage initiatives designed to support those considered "most vulnerable" in disaster situations.

In the near future, the Multimunicipal Civil Protection Committee will begin work for the adoption of a Multimunicipal Civil Protection Policy. This document will explain the major municipal orientations involved, as well as how they will be articulated over time, so that TOGETHER, we can be ready to face up to disasters!

PUBLIC SECURITY

Registry Program for Persons Requiring Special Aid (PRSA)

The Town of Pincourt is committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of all citizens, especially those with specific needs, in the event of a disaster.

The main aim of the PRSA is to identify and understand the specific needs of the population, so that we can act proactively in emergency situations.

This program is intended to establish a voluntary register containing crucial information to ensure rapid and appropriate intervention.

By-Law: MOWERS AND EDGE CUTTERS

It is **permitted** to use a lawnmower or lawn tractor, an edge cutter, a chain saw, a leaf blower or any other power tool:

- Monday to Thursday, 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.;
- Friday, 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.;
- Saturday, Sunday and holidays: 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

By-law: CONSTRUCTION WORK

It is **permitted** to carry out or cause to be carried out construction, repair or demolition work of a building:

- Monday to Thursday, from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.
- Friday, from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- Saturday and Sunday, from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.

By-Law: WATERING

Just a reminder that last year, the rules governing water use changed. Here are the new rules in effect:

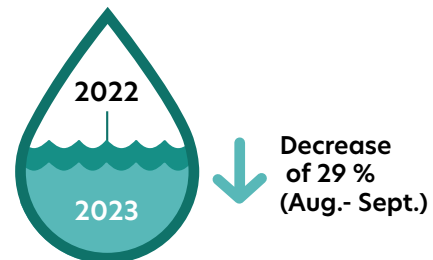
1) Watering periods

Watering of lawns, hedges, trees, shrubs or other vegetation using removable sprinklers, **automatic watering systems or porous hoses is permitted Mondays and Thursdays only, between 8 p.m. and 10 p.m.** Watering using removable sprinklers, automatic sprinklers or porous hoses is **prohibited on other days and outside permitted periods.**

2) Results

Thanks to this change in regulations, the population reduced water consumption by 29% during the months of August and September 2023.

This habit change had a major impact on drinking water consumption. **Let's keep going in 2024!**

You must place your garbage in the black bin provided by the Town. It is recommended that you place your garbage bin at the curb the day before collection, as of 6:00 p.m., to avoid missing the truck on your street.



RECYCLING
Recycling is collected every Monday.

Food waste is collected every Wednesday.

BULK WASTE

GREEN WASTE
Green waste is collected every second Wednesday, from May to November.
Spring and fall leaf collection takes place five times a year, twice in the spring and three times in the fall. The dates will be announced on our website.



BRANCHES
Branch collection takes place every 4th week of the month, from May to October.
Branches must be placed at the curb by Monday morning. Due to high demand, the collection of branches may take place over several days.
The large end of the branches must be facing the street.
