Watering Bylaw

Fall 2025 Daylight

Saving Time Change

This fall, the time change will occur on

the night of November 1st to 2nd, 2025,

Here are the main points of the bylaw:

1) Watering Periods

Watering lawns, hedges, trees, shrubs, or other plants using removable sprinklers, an automatic watering system, or porous hoses is only permitted on **Mondays and Thursdays, between 8 p.m. and 10 p.m.**

Watering with removable sprinklers, an automatic watering system, or porous hoses **is prohibited** on all other days and **outside of these permitted periods**.
