MAJOR PROJECTS IN 019

Each year, the Town of Pincourt makes the necessary investments to ensure its citizens' safety and quality of life. For 2019, the town's three-year plan provides for work and acquisitions totalling \$17 million, including the upgrade of Chemin Duhamel, construction of Chemin des Tours and reconstruction of the pool chalet.



POOL BASIN REHABILITATION AND RECONSTRUCTION OF THE OLYMPIQUE PARK CHALET

Initially, the main reason for initiating the work was to ensure the competition swimming pool depth was brought up to standard.

The pool chalet was also very old, and it was decided to review the building's layout. In the future, there will be two separate buildings: one reserved for lifeguards and the other dedicated to the mechanical room and locker rooms. The chalet will also feature more toilets and changing rooms than before. A family-accessible and adapted toilet will also be accessible near the swimming pool.

The swimming pool is set to reopen in June. However, due to weather conditions and unforeseen events, the opening could be delayed.



REHABILITATION OF CHEMIN DUHA-MEL AND CONSTRUCTION OF THE CHEMIN DES TOURS

Starting in the spring, the Town of Pincourt will begin the reconstruction of Chemin Duhamel from 22nd Avenue to Bellevue Park.

Another project that will see the light of day is the construction of a new street, Chemin des Tours. This new street will be located between Impasse Dougan and 26th Avenue.

Since Chemin Duhamel is a one-way, Chemin des Tours will provide an additional alternative for residents to access Boulevard Cardinal-Léger more quickly.

This new road will also ease traffic, during summer, when finishing the reconstruction of chemin Duhamel between Impasse St-Pierre and 22nd Avenue.

received the *Municipalité amie des enfants (MAE)* accreditation



In February, Pincourt received the *Municipalité amie des enfants (MAE*) certification.

WHAT IS AN MAE?

An $M\!A\!E$ is a municipality committed to respecting the rights of children. Their views, needs, and priorities are an integral part of public decisions, policies, and programs.

In short, it is a municipality who thinks about the children in all its actions.

The purpose of the $M\!A\!E$ program is to recognize the achievements and intentions of a municipality regarding the importance given to the child in the development of his service offer.

To date, in Quebec, 52 municipalities and one RCM have qualified for the *Municipalité amie des enfants* accreditation.

Pincourt is the first town in the MRC de Vaudreuil-Soulanges to have received this certification.



OUR COMMITMENTS

By signing the charter of the MAE, Pincourt undertakes, as part of its responsibilities, to support the implementation of the charter and to promote the development of projects for children within its municipality.

THE TOWN OF PINCOURT HAS COMMITTED TO:

- Include children in its next consultation aimed at setting up a citizen participation action plan. With the help of the *Maison de la Famille*, we plan to consult the children who attend Pincourt's three primary schools.
- Increase its Recreation and Leisure offering for its youth clientele (e.g., science courses, free gym, etc.) and hopes to introduce at least three new courses or activities to meet the needs of young people aged 7 to 14.
- Set up a parents' committee to oversee the offering of activities for stay-at-home parents or those on parental leave.



SUSTAINABLE ELOPMENT

Public Consultation

In January, the Town of Pincourt held a public consultation on sustainable development.

This meeting was meant to lay the foundation for the Sustainable Development Policy to be adopted in the spring of 2019.

During the consultation, around 40 people were invited to express their views on:

- Sustainable development values relevant to Pincourt;
- Sustainable development orientations Pincourt should prioritize:
- Their vision for Pincourt in the next few years.



NEW REGULATION IN EFFECT PLASTIC BAG BAN IN RETAIL STORES

On April 22, in honour of Earth Day, the Town of Pincourt adopted a new by-law prohibiting the use of single-use plastic shopping bags on its territory.

By banning plastic bags in retail stores, the Town of Pincourt is following in the footsteps of the municipalities of Greater Montreal by doing its part and contributing to the global collective environmental initiative by encouraging consumers and retailers to adopt eco-responsible behaviour.

WHAT'S THE REASON FOR THE BAN ON SINGLE-USE PLASTIC BAGS?

Between 1.4 and 2.7 billion shopping bags, mainly made of plastic, are distributed each year in Quebec. Only 14% of these bags are recycled. The ban on single-use plastic bags aims to reduce the impact of plastic bags on the environment.

BAGS TARGETED BY THE BAN

The ban applies to the distribution of plastic shopping bags less than 50 microns thick and also covers oxo-biodegradable, biodegradable and compostable bags.



GOALS

In practical terms, the plastic bag ban aims to:

- Support reduction at the source.
- Encourage the use of reusable and recyclable bags.
- Reduce the number of abandoned plastic bags in terrestrial and marine ecosystems.
- Stem the volume of bags sent to landfills entirely by 2025
- Harmonize municipal regulations over the MMC's territory.



Sustainable Development Policy **Now Adopted**

Following a major consultation process that began in November 2018 and targeted both citizens and its own employees, the Town of Pincourt finally launched its very first Sustainable Development Policy last June 5.

With the participation of its elected representatives, its employees and citizens, the Town of Pincourt is committed to acting responsibly in regard to the environmental and to being socially inclusive, all while adopting a transparent and cooperative approach and promoting its culture, identity and multicultural heritage.

Last August, the Town distributed a guide outlining the policy's major thrusts, including the values it espouses and the objectives established for every aspect of sustainable development.



INSTALLATION OF A PEDESTRIAN CROSSING LIGHTING SYSTEM ON CARDINAL-LÉGER BOULEVARD

No doubt you noticed, the signage on Cardinal-Léger Boulevard, at Trotter Park, changed last November.
