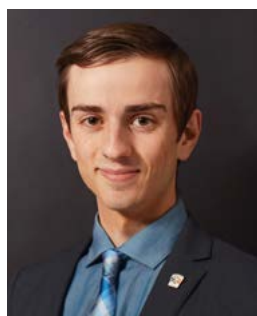

# 60 YEARS OF HISTORY

## 1960 to 2020 – Pincourt, the town

After obtaining its town status in 1960, the Pincourt territory rapidly urbanized. Successive town councils worked hard to establish a wide variety of services for an ever-growing population.

In the 1961 census, Pincourt had a population of 2,685, compared to 14,558 in 2016. Much of this remarkable growth can be attributed to the local authorities' vision of the future. Throughout this period, they maintained a constant pace to offer Pincourt residents a rich and varied living environment adapted to their needs.

## Milestones

- 1963:** Inauguration of the Marion-Walker wastewater treatment plant
- 1965:** Establishment of the Pincourt municipal library in a former pumping station
- 1978:** Establishment of the Parks and Recreation Department, which has become the Pincourt Recreation and Community Services Department.
- 1980:** Construction of low-cost housing on Duhamel Boulevard by the Société d'habitation du Québec
- 1980:** Inaugural Firemen's Day
- 1982:** Inauguration of the fire station
- 1986:** Adoption of the "Pincourtois" demonym
- 1995:** Launch of a first responder service
- 1996:** Construction of the Omni-Centre
- 2003:** Opening of the Chêne-Bleu High School and Library
- 2010:** Opening of the Desjardins Kiosk at Olympique Park

# SITES CONSTRUCTION



## 1 699 CARDINAL-LÉGER BOULEVARD PROJECT: FIRE STATION AND MUNICIPAL GARAGE

Project area: 1450 m<sup>2</sup>

**Description:** The new building will house both the Emergency and Fire Protection Department and the Public Works and Infrastructure Department. Existing buildings, such as the fire station and the municipal garage, will stay where they are.

The new building will bring the offices of the fire department, preventionists and firefighters under one roof and will include a cafeteria, an emergency measures room, a dormitory and a training room.

In the public works area, there will be the departmental administrative offices.

The building will have a total of seven garage doors, including four spaces dedicated to mechanics, a car wash and two for fire trucks.

## PINCOURT AND NOTRE-DAME-DE-L'ÎLE-PERROT INTERMUNICIPAL COLLABORATION

The Town of Pincourt and Notre-Dame-de-l'Île-Perrot are currently working on a fire safety agreement. This potential collaboration aims to improve the Fire Protection Department's response time and services offered to the population.

In particular, the respective Fire Protection Departments considered which vehicles could be used jointly and which ones would be lacking when it comes to serving both municipalities.

# CIVIL SECURITY

## INSTALLATION OF A SIREN

*If you've been to Shamrock Park recently, you may have noticed a post with a speaker. This set-up is a siren.*

This new tool stems from a governmental public safety grant program that began in 2018.

In the event of a major incident, such as a train derailment for instance, the siren will serve as a warning to the population. The siren can be heard at a distance of 2 km.

The siren was installed at this location due to its proximity to 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue and shops located close to the train tracks.

No sound test is planned for the moment. Neighbouring areas will be notified in advance if necessary. These areas will also be informed of the procedures to follow should the siren be triggered for real.
