





Daily payment is not available for the daycare service, and it is non-refundable. The daycare service is reserved for children enrolled in the day camp only.

DISCOUNT

Summer package: When purchasing 6 weeks of camp for the same child, the 7th week is free. (Excluding the mini-camp and daycare service)

Family Package (3 or more children): 40% discount for the 3rd child and beyond. (Excluding the mini-camp and daycare service)

REFUND POLICY

- Fees are 100% refundable if the activity is canceled by the Town.
- Cancellation and refund requests must be sent by email to the Recreation Department at <u>loisirs@villepincourt.qc.ca</u>.
 Before Friday, June 20, the Town will refund 100% of the costs, minus a \$10 administration fee.
- Starting June 23, a refund will only be issued on a prorated basis for the services rendered, minus a \$10 administration fee, and only if accompanied by relevant supporting documentation (e.g., a medical certificate). The prorated amount is calculated from the date the request is received.
- Refund requests received after the end of an activity will not be accepted.

NOTE: The Town of Pincourt reserves the right to request proof of residency at any time and to expel any child with behavioral issues without a refund.

SUPPORT PROGRAM for Children living with an Intellectual and/or Physical Disability

This program is designed for children aged 4 to 14 in Pincourt who are living with an intellectual and/or physical disability or who require support to participate in activities. It provides access to a support worker during day camp and daycare, with the aim of facilitating children's participation and integration. Children may be paired based on their individual needs.

Procedure:

• You must complete the evaluation form, available on the Town's Website, to assess your child's needs during the registration period. (See: Villepincourt.qc.ca/camp-de-jour-de-pincourt).

- Send the completed form before April 15 to <u>loisirs@</u>
 <u>villepincourt.qc.ca</u> so that the Town of Pincourt can arrange
 for a support worker for your child.
- Once your application is approved by the Recreation Department, we will proceed with the registration, and you will be able to pay the registration fees under the same conditions as the regular day camp participants.






