

## **Pincourt Inaugurates the Art Pathway**

Today, the Town of Pincourt is proud to inaugurate the Art Pathway project, an initiative aimed at highlighting culture and enhancing the landscape. The artistic design of the footbridge began in the fall of 2023, and several partnerships were necessary, including an agreement with the Ministère de la Culture et des Communications.



## An Artistic and Collective Initiative

The project consists of two sections of artworks. The first part, themed around neighbourhood life, is located between Bellevue Street and Loiselle Street and was created using recycled materials. The second part, themed around trees, is located between Loiselle Street and Cardinal-Léger Boulevard. To ensure the longevity of the artworks, they have been treated to withstand Quebec's four seasons. The goal

is to adorn the fences with beautiful works of art, highlighting the district and vegetation of Pincourt.

## A Fruitful and Generous Collaboration

The Town of Pincourt's Design Committee played a key role in setting up this project. More than 30 dedicated volunteers contributed their time and effort for free to create these artworks. In addition to the important collaboration of the Recreation and Public Works Department.
