Important: On Friday, October 1, 2021, the office will be open continuously from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

3. If more than one person wishes to be a candidate for the same seat, you may exercise your voting right by going to your assigned polling station **between 9:30 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.** on the following dates:

Polling day: Sunday, November 7, 2021

Advance polling day: Sunday, October 31, 2021

Other advance polling day: Saturday, October 30, 2021

Voting day at the office of the returning officer: Monday, November 1, 2021
Voting day at the office of the returning officer: Tuesday, November 2, 2021
Voting day at the office of the returning officer: Wednesday, November 3, 2021

## Exceptional measures related to the health situation (vote by mail – COVID-19)

- 7. You can vote by mail if you are in one of the following situations:
  - You are domiciled in an eligible health establishment<sup>1</sup>.
  - You are domiciled in the municipality, but are unable to travel for health reasons or you are a caregiver domiciled at the same address as such a person.
  - Between Sunday, October 17, 2021, and Wednesday, October 27, 2021, you must comply with an order or a recommendation for isolation from public health authorities because you:
    - returned from a trip abroad within the last 14 days;
    - o were diagnosed with COVID-19 and you are still considered a carrier of the disease;
    - o are showing COVID-19 symptoms;
    - have been in contact with a suspected, probable or confirmed case of COVID-19 within the last 14 days;
    - o are waiting for a COVID-19 test result.

To vote by mail, eligible electors must make a verbal or written request to the returning officer no later than October 27, 2021.

If you are registered to vote by mail and you have not received your ballot papers a few days after their sending, you can contact the returning officer to obtain new ones.

Ballot papers must be received at the office of the returning officer no later than Friday, November 5, 2021, at 4:30 p.m.lf you are requesting to vote by mail because you must comply with an order or a recommendation from public health authorities to isolate, your request will be valid for the current poll only.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Eligible health establishment are hospital centres, CHSLDs, rehabilitation centres and private seniors' residences listed in the register established under the *Act respecting health services and social services* (chapter S-4.2) and hospital centres or reception centres within the meaning of the *Act respecting health services and social services for Cree Native persons* (chapter S-5).
