The concept of Relay For Life for the benefit of the Canadian Cancer Society is simple: teams or individuals who have raised funds to walk and take turns day and night around a marked path of lights in honor of or in memory of people affected by the disease. Let's get to know their stories!

Now 44 years old, Karina Trahan was diagnosed on September 29, 2011, with a uterine carcinosarcoma. Quickly, she was taken in charge by the dedicated medical staff of Hôpital Notre-Dame (CHUM) in order to stop this evil, which was then at a critical stage. After having undergone surgery, several chemotherapies, radiotherapy, and brachytherapy treatments, she is now in remission. Despite the illness, she participated in the Relay and continues to do so now, 7 years later. First as part of a team and then as a participant in the Survivors' Tour. For her, the Relais symbolizes the strength and courage of the people affected and pays them a fine tribute. She, who received help from the CCS when she needed it, wants to give back and help those affected by cancer.

Mrs. Mélanie Trahan was also shaken when she also learned that the disease would be part of her life, and this, 6 weeks after the diagnosis of her twin sister. She also has cancer of the uterus and ovaries, she was followed by the same doctor and the same team as her sister. After having undergone multiple treatments and benefited from the help and support of her family and the CCS, she learned in 2015 that recidivism was present. Redoubling her courage and determination, she had to live with serenity the appropriate treatments to stop cancer. She was captain of a team named Carpe Diem for several years and participated for 7 years as a survivor at the Relay. For her, the Relais embodies the best of treatments because it includes loving, optimistic and determined people who give the taste to continue to bite in life. The disease strikes, regardless of age, and transforms those who meet it but does not change the essence of who we really are.

Together, they salute the last moment and are most grateful to live for each new year, to breathe new candles on their cake and to welcome the virtues transported by the wisdom of the time.
